WHEREAS, Nevada County is a community that takes pride in its historical origins, and its important place in the growth and development of our nation, and;

WHEREAS, Nevada County is a community that is committed to protecting the rights of all the people in the county, and valuing the rights of all those outside its borders, and;

WHEREAS, the Nevada County Government is charged with the duty of ensuring that the rights of all its citizens are protected, and;

WHEREAS, the first ten amendments to the United States Constitution, known as the Bill of Rights, outline the most essential rights of people which must be protected and represent a shield which guards our citizens from potential government abuses;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Nevada County Board of Supervisors recognizes and honors December 15, 2001 as “Bill of Rights Day in Nevada County” and urges all Nevada County citizens to take time that day for thoughtful consideration of the Bill of Rights, in order to further their appreciation of that document which is so vital to our American system of government.
